TOPIC:	NOTES AND ACTIONS:
Karin - Rack Cards	Put out by Davis County Health Department via WIC which list intra-agency resources in the area. Distributed to local hospitals, La Leche League, etc. WIC clinics can pay for these using Peer Counselor funds. Company called Next Day Flyers made the cards for Davis.
Update:	Photos for the UBC website. Women need to be able to submit their breastfeeding photos through the site; the link is broken right now.
Teachers and Students -	There have been issues with school districts allotting time and space for teen moms to pump and store milk on campus. These problems are being seen in the traditional high schools. Amy states - we should write a newspaper article to raise awareness.
Directory - BF-Friendly Professionals.	Where is this available for preview? This is a perk for members. It needs a link on the website. Active members have access to this.
UBC Membership	- for WIC this can be purchased using the Peer Counselor budget
	- Weber/Morgan needs to become an Organizational Membership
	- State of Utah WIC Program holds current membership
	- There are only seven current members (49 total, 42 of which are expired). Amy is over this. All coalition board needs to become current. Check from AAP went directly into account, bypassing the treasurer. This may have happened with others.
NEWS:	Newark, NJ Mayor working with Nestle on childhood obesity. The only action taken in the breastfeeding community has been through Facebook.
NEWS/Paula Lowe:	We discussed this in the April meeting as well. Kellymom Facebook feed has a link to the story. This mom wants legislation requiring doctors to use WHO growth charts and a requirement for a portion of doctors' CEUs to be in breastfeeding. She has been in contact with Davis County WIC as well as the state WIC office. Karin has referred her to her

	lawmaker. It seems unlikely that these policies will go into action - there may be more success going through a channel such as UPIQ (Chuck Narlin's group - pediatric improvement) - the suggestion was made that we put this group in touch with Ms. Lowe. Patrice is sending a link to Karin about UPIQ.
	WIC did a training in 2000 with these changes. Hospitals are using the CDC charts. Can we campaign? Provide an online training for growth charts? Or perhaps WIC could provide an inservice training.
	UBC is hesitant to offer advice/response without full information
Treasury:	Unchanged since April meeting.
Update:	Utah Breastfeeding Coalition telephone line has been updated.
Lunches: (Meghan)	- Logan lunch was a success, community lactation people came together: Logan Regional, WIC, and LLL.
	Weber-Davis is next w/ two hours planned.
	Plans for Salt Lake are coming together - this will need to be split into at least north and south Salt Lake.
	We will proceed at a rate of one lunch per month. Judy will look for funds within WIC. UBC is targeting \$3,000 for entire state.
Working with WIC:	Meghan will work with Karin to determine how many hours UBC takes out of WIC time for employees. Judy will work on this as well.
CAFE:	Painting - <i>Breastfeeding Mom in the Camellias</i> is finished and will be auctioned. Salt Lake profited from last years' Cafe. Money was generated via the silent auction.
	Cafe Chairperson is Gina. Volunteer Coordinator is Renee V.
MILK BANK:	Christy met with Kirt Albertson, PhD and Director of research at U of U NICU. He wants to discuss human milk bank.
	Elizabeth should be involved - we will need a task force.
	We have a survey going out to help us with the application process.
	Dr. King will discuss the need for a milk bank with his colleagues.
	Karin drafted a proposal brief - it's available on the UBC website as a PDF. IT will be taken to the University of Utah, Mountain Star, and lasis; Dr. King will follow-through on this.
	Application is almost done - Karin's husband helped draw up a blueprint

	for the lab. Business plan, policy brief, etc. will be shared/forwarded with Judy via Lisa and Karin. Dr. King will give feedback on these documents and disseminate task force before we finalize and send documents.
	Utilization of donor human milk (DHM) in Utah hospitals is coming almost exclusively from Intermountain Hospitals. <b>NEED Clarification:</b> Denver was a net exporter of almost 17,000 oz last year. Utah hospitals used 21,568 oz. Last year, we used 38,382 oz from March to December which works out to about a gallon a day - or 300 gallons total. Hospitals are not having any trouble with insurance on this.
INTERNS:	Two new interns, both named Stephanie will be joining the UBC! We are excited to welcome them into the organization.
Campaign:	Bestfed Beginners to promote Baby Friendly hospital initiative. Out area has been targeted. Deadline to apply May 4, 2012. Hospital has to pay for team travel. Intermountain hospitals are not seeking Baby Friendly status. Terri Keen is working on some components of Baby Friendly. Amy is interested in working on this and will make contacts. Kim will talk with Ogden Regional and Lakeview.
Gina	- is wanting more responsibilities; we need a worksite person, so she was suggested.
Patrice	- has several Business Case kits if anyone needs them. Patrice states that the CDC will release some funds earmarked for breastfeeding. Utah will be applying. This may be geared toward hospitals.
Utah's BF Resource Guide	- is listed by county. There is little to no support for women in rural areas except for WIC. Women in rural areas need to be aware of statewide resources, (listed at the top of all county lists) including the Pregnancy Risk Line and LLL (don't have to call their local group - can call any).
Note:	in the UBC membership pages is there something about the WHO code compliance?
